PROJECT SINGLE PURPOSE

COMMUNITY BASED EQUITABLE, ADEQUATE & SUSTAINABLE WATER SUPPLY SERVICES, AND A DEMAND-LED APPROACH TO SANITATION PROVIDED & FACILITIES USED IN A HYGIENIC MANNER, WITH PROPER DISPOSAL OF WATER

PREAMBLE

The Project Action Plan for the year 1996-97 for the ODA Assisted Project was developed in discussions with all the participating agencies at the workshop which was held in the month of December, 1995. At the workshop, the progress during the year against milestones for each component was reviewed and milestones were set for each project component to be taken up in the coming year. The setting of milestones was done in consensus in a participatory manner. The progress against the 1995-96 PAP milestones was reviewed at the workshop held on 14th and 15th December 1995 and milestones for all project components to be taken up during the year 1996-97 discussed. For the first time, Key Handover milestones were identified. Subsequent to the workshop, the draft PAP 1996-97 was circulated to all the participating agencies for confirmation of dates for achievement of milestones agreed by them at the workshop.

During the year 1996-97, the Physical Works on 80 & 56 village schemes did not progress as per schedule and this resulted in delay in completion and handover of both the schemes. Due to this situtation, the milestones set in December 1995 are required to be revised in PAP 1996-97. At present, the important issues viz. Appointment of Class III staff by District Selection Committee, Creation of WMU for Nasik District and Deficit Financing for Nandgaon Town (conversion of annual loan instalment into grant) are pending for final decision from the GoM. These decisions are expected by end September/early October 1996.

It is to be noted that during the year 1996, the GoM has accorded top priority to drinking water supply and now is in the process of reorganizing the water supply sector upto the field level. Creation of an umbrella organisation and integration of Rural and Urban water supply are the important areas taken up for implementation by the GoM.
